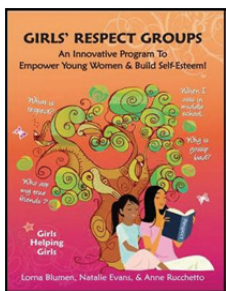
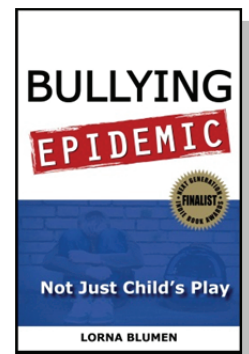


LORNA BLUMEN



Lorna Blumen is an educational consultant and bullying prevention specialist in Toronto, Canada. Lorna is a co-developer of the Girls' Respect Groups High School Leadership Training Program and the GRG Middle School Program, an after-school program for middle-school girls, led by high school girls. Lorna also runs workshops on Bullying Prevention for elementary and middle school kids. She works with adults who work with children – teachers, parents, school councils, mental health professionals, coaches, and camp counsellors.

Lorna is the author of *Bullying Epidemic: Not Just Child's Play* (Camberley Press, 2011). She is also the lead author of *Girls' Respect Groups: An Innovative Program To Empower Young Women & Build Self-Esteem!* (Camberley Press, 2009), which she wrote with two teenage GRG Leaders. Her "Bystanders To Children's Bullying" was published in *The Art of Followership: How Great Followers Create Great Leaders & Great Organizations* (Jossey-Bass, 2008). Lorna was also a contributing author to *When Something's Wrong: Ideas For Families*, the Canadian Psychiatric Research Foundation's best-selling family handbook.

Lorna has appeared on Canadian local and national TV & radio, at international conferences, and has contributed to national magazines for parents and teachers.
